Surviving are his wife, Natalie Y.; one son, Stuart of Northfield; one daughter, Sharon Segal of San Francisco; four sisters, Rose Heiman, Constance Blackman and Molly Albert, all of Philadelphia, and Claire Edelstein of Hallandale, Fla.; and two grandshildren
